#### **Municipal purposes**


- **3** The purposes of a municipality are

  - (c) to develop and maintain safe and viable communities. 1994 cM-26.1 s3









### City of Edmonton Priorities

- Releasing Breathe: Edmonton's Green Network Strategy in early 2017, with ecosystem services as a primary focus.
- Meeting the Urban Forest Management Plan target to double Edmonton's tree canopy.
- Completing both Mill Creek Daylighting Feasibility Study and Southwest Ribbon of Green Master Plan.
- Climate Change Adaptation Strategies in development.
- Changes to the MGA/City Charter to allow municipalities more power to protect natural areas.
